BOTTLE NOSE DOLPHIN

Very social and playful mammals, inhabit warm and temperature seas worldwide



Generally gray in color and get their name from their short, thick snout

SPINNER DOLPHIN

Known for their acrobatics and aerial behaviours, found in off-shore tropical waters around the world



Distinctive three-banded colouring; dark grey on the back, a lighter grey on the flanks and a pale belly.

HUMPBACK WHALE

The humpback whale can live for 80 to 90 years and undertake some of the longest migrations of any mammal



Bodies are primarily black, but individuals have different amounts of white on their pectoral fins, bellies, and the undersides of their flukes



Mothers and their calves can be seen around July and November



HAWKSBILL TURTLE

They are long lived with an estimated life span of 50 to 60 years. Omnivores but their preferred food is sea sponges



Named after their pointed beaks, which resemble those of birds. They can also lay 100 to 250 eggs



Nest in Platte Island between September and March



GREEN TURTLE

The largest hard-shelled marine turtle in the world and can live up to 80 years old



Their shells have five scutes running down the middle and four scutes on each side. They are herbivores feeding on sea grass and algae and can lay to 50 to 150 eggs



Between January and September



EAGLE RAYS

Grow to a maximum length of 5m and are able to breach the water up to several metres above the surface



Diamond-shaped pectoral disc that can reach over 2.7m wide, and is a dramatic dark color scattered with light spots or rings

The world's only pure white tern. These terns are known to feed on aquatic and some ground insects



Black spot behind its eyes with white plumage and a long black bill. Known to fly in pairs

RED-TAIL TROPIC

Phaeton Rubricauda

It is one the rarest birds found on the island but not considered threatened



Pure bright white feathered bird with a large slightly downcurved red bill and thin red tail



October to July during the breeding season



BROWN NODDY

Anous stolidus

Known to be the largest of all the Noddies. The female only lays a single egg during the breeding season



Brown Noddy is all dark with a whitish cap and has a wedge-shaped tail.



March and October



LESSER NODDY

Anous tenuirostris

The first formal description of the Lesser Noddy was by the Dutch zoologist Coenraad Jacob Temminck in 1823



Dark brown on its upper parts and charcoal grey on its underparts. The Lesser Noddy has a very thin bill.

LESSER FRIGATE

Fregate Ariel

Lesser Frigatebird are built for flying they rarely swim and cannot walk but can manage to climb around the trees and bushes



Brownish-black plumage, long narrow wings and a deeply forked tail
